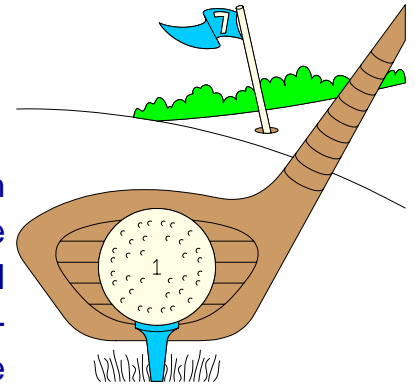

Scholarship

Scholarship Applications to be mailed in October

The Electrical Association of Rochester will once again award two (2) Academic Scholarships of \$1000 each to be used towards the cost of tuition in the 2009-2010 academic year and two (2) School to Work Scholarships of \$500 each to be used towards the cost of tools in the 2009 calendar year.



Each scholarship applicant will be evaluated on the basis of academic achievement and personal characteristics. Academic Scholarships will be granted upon verification of attendance in an undergraduate program at an accredited school.

School to Work Scholarships will be awarded to individuals pursuing a career in the electric industry and participating in a training program to be used for the purchase of tools. The training program may be an apprentice program or other formal training program subject to approval by the Electrical Association board. School to Work Scholarships will be granted upon submission of a properly completed reimbursement form.

Each applicant is required to complete the appropriate application form and submit it with supporting documentation as noted on the application. Scholarship Applications will be mailed this October and will be available on the EAR website at www.earoch.com.

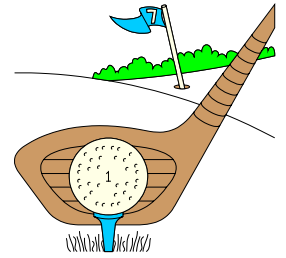
