

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM



2010-2011 APPLICATION

**Deadline for Submission:
January 15, 2010**

The Electrical Association of Rochester will award two (2) Academic Scholarships of \$1000 to be used towards the cost of tuition in the 2010-2011 academic year and (2) School to Work Scholarships of \$500 to be used towards the cost of tools in the calendar year 2010.

The scholarships will be awarded on a competitive basis. Members of the Electrical Association of Rochester and Registrants of the Construction and Maintenance Division, their children, and/or wards are eligible. The applicant must reside in the greater Rochester area [consistent with the Association's bylaws]. Only one scholarship can be granted per person. Previous applicants are encouraged to reapply.

The scholarships are awarded without regard to race, color, creed, sex or national origin and will be awarded on the basis of merit. Each scholarship applicant will be evaluated on the basis of academic achievement and personal characteristics.

The applications will be reviewed by a Scholarship Selection Committee composed of non-Electrical Association members.

Each applicant is required to complete the appropriate application form and submit it with supporting documentation as noted on the application.

Academic Scholarships will be granted upon verification of attendance in an undergraduate program at an accredited school. Payment will be made to the school.

School to Work Scholarships will be awarded to individuals pursuing a career in the electric industry and participating in a training program to be used for the purchase of tools. The training program may be an apprentice program or other formal training program subject to approval by the Electrical Association Board. School to Work Scholarships will be granted upon submission of a properly completed reimbursement form.

5. Submit an essay, 200 words or less written by you, stating the reasons why you are seeking this scholarship, some reflections about yourself, your best work experiences and your goals/objectives.
